

**Frank Bauhm:** The mayor took control of a city budget in 2008 that was approx \$89 million. The mayor then built the annual city casino allotment of approx \$18 mil DIRECTLY into the ANNUAL BUDGET, increasing it to about \$107 mil. With the casino funds GONE the annual budget is SHORT by that amount. This isn't rocket science...the mayor mis-managed the money with the blessing

of the council since 2008. The state directed the city to use casino funds for provable economic development projects. Instead the city largely used it for salaries, stipends, office equipment, patronage jobs, overtime, loans and grants to city hall friends, \$50 mil courthouse, \$44 mil train station, vehicles, consultants, outside lawyers, building trades program, industrial park project and the list is endless. NOW

\*\*\* THE CUPBOARD IS BARE and the administration is crying to the media (three newspapers and a TV station in a week). Mayor Dyster won the lottery and now he's broke. That should be the HEADLINE.

**Robert Russell:** Cuomo didn't care about Niagara Falls when he renegotiated the compact. It was his stupidity that led to him extending the exclusivity without extending the payments. Technically, the Senecas are in the right here.

**Charlie McNeely:** The move that the Senecas pulled with no payments after 2016 was genius. Heads should roll of whomever didn't catch this in the contracts. Dyster is only out for himself and looking for an appointed position with Cuomo.

**Anthony Antonacci:** The only solution that should of took place years ago was to bring in a spending control board. We have received \$250 million from the Seneca's since the casino opened. The people of Niagara Falls are so stupid to keep electing Dyster. The definition of insanity is to keeping doing the same thing and expecting a different result. I'm very disgusted and frustrated along with many other people with the way this city is managed and I place blame on the city council too for their decisions.

**Ian Stirling:** The original compact

was crap, and they bought it. They received the money and squandered it, we let them. I don't trust them with a single dime, don't care if they found it on the floor. I do not want to see any agreement until we have responsible leadership in OUR offices.

We need new fresh leaders that will ignore the Senecas money and focus on rebuilding without them. Later, when a reasonable and achievable plan is in place, ask them to partner with the city. Rebuild, not plunder.

**Geoff Conkey:** The City bankrupted itself with its own fiscal illiteracy. This is not the Seneca's fault whatsoever. This money was never intended to creep into the general budget, nor was it meant to be blown on brilliant ideas with absolutely no return on investment like the train or police stations. There is zero competence, nor has there been for several decades, in city or county government. Even if they accomplish the imaginary goal of becoming a Mecca for tourism, it will do absolutely nothing in terms of creating enough jobs/wealth to regenerate the decaying swaths of the city. This is all pretend. I hate to say this, but barring a miracle, anyone who says the city isn't heading towards insolvency is either a fool or choosing to be ignorant

## DAYS OF GLORY, AND 'BABY' JOE MESI LONG GONE FOR FALLS

There was a time not too long ago when the City of Niagara Falls was capable of putting on a show that could attract thousands of visitors without the lure of a slot machine.

That was, of course, before the Seneca Niagara Casino opened on Fourth St. on Dec. 31, 2002, on the site formerly occupied by the Niagara Falls Convention and Civic Center.

It was just the year before--in 2001--that thousands jammed the old Convention Center to see "Baby" Joe Mesri score two TKO victories on his way to the world number one ranking in putting together one of the longest unbeaten records in professional boxing history, 36 in all.

Tonawanda native "Baby" Joe Mesri was at the height of his fame when he took the ring in Niagara Falls, known as the region's "third professional franchise" with the Bills and Sabres being the other two and as popular a sports figure this area has ever known.

It looked like the sky was the limit for Mesri's career as fans recall the excitement generated by his ring exploits, particularly those two nights in April and in July in Niagara Falls when he stopped highly regarded Cuban fighter Jorge Luis Gonzalez and then won a TKO over "Smokin" Joe Cooper who had once fought for the heavyweight title.

"I was at both fights and the excitement was incredible," recalls Angelo Morinello who owns the Italian restaurant La Cucina Di Mamma in Niagara Falls. "It seemed like everybody was there, everybody you knew came to cheer on "Baby Joe."

They were great times for "Baby" Joe and Niagara Falls, and while Mesri's boxing career was cut short by injury in 2004 when he was sidelined for two years by a head injury, losing his number one ranking by the World Boxing Council, he never lost his popularity with local fans, the ones that turned out to see him take the ring in Niagara Falls.

Mesri was recently inducted into the New York State Boxing Hall of Fame and will be inducted into the Greater Buffalo Sports Hall of Fame in October with details set to be announced at a June 6 press conference in Buffalo at the Key Center.

The honors may be a little late coming, but nonetheless "Baby" Joe is grateful and appreciative his unbeaten career is finally being recognized and he vividly recalls the fights in Niagara Falls.

"It was just a great venue and I'll

never forget those nights," said "Baby" Joe recently. "It was a big part of my career and my boxing history, and I'm so glad I was able to give Niagara Falls and Western New York something to cheer about.

Joe and his wife Michele have three children and these days Joe works as a medical supply salesman for Abbott Medical.

His ring victories in Niagara Falls are in stark contrast to the dismal plight of the Cataract City these days as it struggles to even come up with \$25,000

for a July 4th fireworks display in the midst of the gaming dispute that has depleted the city's treasury with no slot revenue coming in.

There's no savior in sight for the city's bleak financial situation and it is too bad there wasn't a sports star like a Joe Mesri to ride into town and give everybody a lift, like he did not too long ago at a venue that is now part of the city's history.

Maybe in hindsight, city and state leaders would have been better off keeping the Convention Center around

and putting on events instead of putting all their money on a gambling casino that pays no taxes and pays nothing for the use of the land in the center of the city as the gaming dispute drags on. Too bad you can't come back for one more great fight, Joe. Niagara Falls could sure use your drawing power in the same way the city was able to cash in on Nik Wallenda's tightrope walk across the falls in 2012.

Sadly, Nik is gone, and so are you. But Niagara Falls won't forget either one of you anytime soon.

## Pieces of History Are Up for Sale in North Tonawanda

Pieces of History are up for sale. The North Tonawanda History Museum announced it is selling off some of its items. Because of the recent court cause the Museum is being forced to move from its Webster Street location to a location on Oliver Street. Executive Director Howard Roeske says they have been packing up some of the stuff and then selling the stuff that they do not have room for at the new location, for him seeing some of the unique artifacts from North Tonawanda is bittersweet.

"I have mixed feelings cause some of the things were made here or have significant historical value to the area, on the other hand, prior to a couple of years ago anything that was brought to the door was accepted and it should not have been, so those things I am not sorry to see go," said Roeske.

Items from the 1930's, through the 1960's are up for sale and includes everything from books to

even an old may tag washing machine. They are being sold for cash only and on a first come first serve basis.

The move is not finalized yet and they only have until June 4rd to get into the new space. Roeske says once they get into the space it will then be about another 3 weeks to move everything into the new space.

He describes the move as being broken down into a three-step process, "The first phase is over and that is packing the things we will need for the new home. The second phase is to eliminate the things that we are not going forward with, that include a lot of store fixtures, furnishing, file cabinets, chairs, etc., and some artifacts," said Roeske.

The third and last step of this first phase will be the actual moving of the museums artifacts and records to the new location. Then the second phase of the project will begin including edifice modification and creating new displays.

Money raised from the sale will



be used for preservation and display of the retained artifacts and acquiring future artifacts. Pick up times for large items purchased will be arranged at sale time. Smaller items may be taken immediately.

For some shoppers getting a chance to buy some of these items is a once in a lifetime opportunity. "I just wanted to see what was for sale. The History Museum is a great place and I hate to see it leave Webster Street. I love North Tonawanda history, so I thought if there was anything that got my attention I would grab it," said Jay Soemann,

North Tonawanda Resident.

That final phase is expected to be complete after 10 to 12 weeks with the opening of the re-born museum to be in the second half of September. Following the grand reopening, a robust autumn and winter set of events will be taking place.

**Workplace Fire Prevention Safety**

OSHA requirements for multiple exits, unblocked doors, clear pathways and fire extinguishing equipment are in effect today in part because of the Triangle Shirtwaist Company. When fire erupted at that New York City factory in 1911, lack of water, locked doors and inadequate fire escapes trapped workers inside and led to 146 deaths. Injuries and deaths from fires still happen, but the numbers have been reduced thanks to OSHA guidelines.

It's easier than you think for a construction site or any workplace to go up in flames. All it takes is a spark from a sander or an errant ash from a cigarette igniting with common and flammable construction materials like wood, solvents, packaging and gasoline. Thousands of construction fires happen annually and they are costly. According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), six fires in apartment complexes under construction were among the largest fires in the country in 2014 and led to damages of more than \$176 million dollars. Five of these fires, including one involving a heater used to dry drywall, were caused by heat sources installed or placed too close to flammable materials. Grinding work done too close to woodwork was the source of another blaze. Heat from welding or cutting operations caused three others. Fires killed six construction workers in 2014 and injured 120 more.

One of the most important things you can do on a construction site is practice good housekeeping. It's also important that workers are aware of potential fire hazards at a jobsite and report fire hazards immediately. They need to be familiar with what to do in case of fire, including how to operate a fire extinguisher and how to safely evacuate. OSHA standard 1926.150 requires employers to implement workplace fire protection and prevention plans at construction sites. Hazards covered include storage and disposal of flammable liquids, blasting and the use of explosives as well as the placement of temporary heaters and other machinery that gets hot during operation. If a fire breaks out leave the job site immediately and call 9-1-1.


