





ing is widely credited with helping spur the FBI investigation" into the self-help group led by Ranieri. Many other newspapers and blog sites have also credited Parlato's work with putting an end to the NX-IVM's sex-slave ring of terror.

Parlato says he blew the whistle on Ranieri's crimes to the FBI in 2015 and he followed that up with countless stories about the ritual sex abuse and branding activities in blog accounts and in newspaper reports which finally succeeded in attracting the attention of federal

investigators. "It was the branding [of the women] that finally got the government's attention," said Parlato.

Parlato's relentless public pursuit of Ranieri and his wicked sex cult activities finally resulted in the indictment of the "genius" NXIVM master and guilty pleas from several of his associates, including the rich and famous, leading to the trial that ended with Ranieri's conviction.

During that trial, several women testified they were branded with Ranieri's initials as part of their involvement in what prosecutors


called a secrecy society of "sex slaves" within the NXIVM community near Albany. It took less than five hours to convict Ranieri who faces up to life in prison when he's sentenced Sept. 25. Ranieri is expected to appeal, possibly with financial help from Clare Bronfman, one of the Seagram's heiresses who bankrolled Ranieri's cult and is now on probation.

But there is still much more to report on the NXIVM story and Investigation Discovery will produce a two-hour special on members of the NXIVM cult who have either died or disappeared in a December special called "The Lost Women of NXIVM," featuring the work of Frank Parlato, that will be aired in 150 countries.

"They (Investigative Discovery) have been in Niagara Falls working on the special and I have spent days with them," said Parlato. "They have done a great deal of preliminary work and I will be traveling to various locations, including Alaska, Seattle, Los Angeles, Austin, and Albany – former headquarters of Nxivm, with them to try and capture the extent and yes, the still unknown pieces, of this horrible tale of the brutal cult led by Ranieri."

The Discovery-owned true-crime and mystery network Investigation Discovery selected Apple Entertainment to produce the special with the goal of taking viewers inside the active investigation to explore what really happened to Kristin Snyder, Gina Hutchinson, and




other women of the cult by tracking down past members, informants and eyewitnesses. Frank Parlato will be featured for his experience with NXIVM as a former publicist and for his tireless and extensive work in revealing the full extent of the atrocities under Raniere's reign

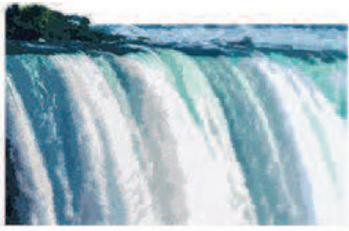

WEEKLY HEADLINES

-Niagara Falls Police, while on patrol, observed a vehicle driving recklessly on 19th Street on July 1st, 2019. The car passed through several stop signs without stopping. Moments later the reckless driver crashed into a pick-up truck driven by a man visiting from Canada. After the crash, a male exited his vehicle and began to fight with the officer before running away. Police then engaged on a foot chase. About a half hour after the crash, the registered owner of the striking vehicle reported that her vehicle stolen stating that she left it running in her garage before it was taken. Police are continuing to investigate the incident.

-Niagara Falls Police responded at 1925 Main Street on July 3rd, 2019, after receiving a call that a barefoot woman went on a joy ride on the back of a flatbed tow truck after her vehicle was reposed from the 500 block of 20th Street overnight. 





old Thomas Payne arrived at City Hall with a van believed to be filled with explosives. Although police did not discover any explosives, they did find two loaded rifles. Alderman At Large Robert Pecoraro put forth the resolution and says now is the time to act.

"I really don't think us just talking about it and not acting is the right way to move forward," said Pecoraro.

It is not yet known who would be on the committee but it would be chaired by Pecoraro. He is a retired Air Force colonel and says it will focus on two areas of safety.

"I first want to look at the physical security of City Hall and other municipal buildings," said Pecoraro. "The second piece of this is looking at the cyber security."

He says he plans on meeting with the police chief to work out more details and says local residents will be updated on the progress on the committee.

Not everyone on the council was agreement of the committee voicing that more detail is needed. Others, however, say this is just a first step

and it's too early for the specifics of the group.

"I think to form the committee is a first step," said Common Council President Eric Zadzilka. "Defining the committee will be based on the chief's recommendations. Such as who should be on it."

Working on better access control in and out of City Hall is not something new. Mayor Art Pappas says he has been wanting to make the building safer for years.

"I have made this suggestion as long as two or three years ago that we really should be doing something about additional security of this building. This is an old building where there is easy access in and out. It is very open," said Pappas.

By vote of three to one the recommendation passed. Alderman Mark Berube was absent from the meeting and Alderman-At-Large Austin Tylec was the only dissenting council member.

"Throughout history things happened because too many people failed to act and they only talked about it. This is the time for action," said Pecoraro.

It's all part of the 9th annual Project Hope campaign, which stands for "Helping Others Paint Exteriors." The event is held by Painters Plus Home Decorating and members of the Chamber of Commerce.

Are Safety Helmets Coming for Your Hard Hat?

A new generation of head protection is arriving. Several construction companies are incorporating or switching to safety helmets for their workers in favor of the traditional hard hat. What's the reason for the change? The answer is simple, and one we don't hear often enough in construction – improving safety on the job. As anyone who has spent time on a construction site knows, hazards come in all directions and include more than a stray tool or piece of material falling from above. Falling to the ground from a roof or being struck in the head by a steel beam being transported across a worksite are only a couple examples of when a hard hat may not help protect workers.

One major limitation of the current hard hat is that it's prone to fall off a worker's head if they slip, trip or fall. That's because our head tends to snap back in these moments, leading to a fall without any head protection. Because hard hats use a suspension system instead of a chin strap, they can also fall off if a worker bends forward or looks up. The other safety issue with the current hard hat is that its design makes it poorly suited to deflect or absorb a blow to the side or back of the head. While the typical hard hat offers some protection in these areas, its primary purpose has always been stopping objects from above. Workers who are struck by objects in the side or back of the head risk concussions and more serious traumatic brain injuries (TBIs) that can affect both long-term physical health as well as mental health. The construction industry has the greatest number of both fatal and nonfatal TBIs among U.S. workplaces. From 2003 to 2010, more than 2,200 construction workers died due to TBIs. These deaths represented 25 percent of all construction fatalities. It's not difficult to imagine how many of these lives could have been saved – or the severity of the TBI reduced – if workers had improved head protection.

The safety helmets being used today by construction contractors resemble helmets used in cycling, climbing and many other sports. They provide better coverage for the sides and back of the head than hard hats and use an interior foam lining for additional impact resistance. These helmets also feature an adjustable chin strap, and most go even further by providing ventilation and an optional integrated visor. These visors function as built-in safety goggles, meeting the OSHA requirement for eye protection and eliminating the need for an extra piece of PPE. These changes add up to much better overall head protection for workers. The two main deterrents to industry wide implementation and usage of these new helmets are significantly higher cost and a heavier feel which some workers do not like.




